Lib Dem MSPs in the Scottish Parliament have been active holding the SNP majority government to account.

Alison McInnes MSP (North East Scotland) led the charge on the Government's rushed and poorly thought out sectarianism bill. She told Ministers, "I think that the Government are naïve if they believe they can solve a centuries old problem by rushing through new legislation in the next fortnight." The Government eventually backed down and agreed to extend the consideration of the Bill.

**Liam McArthur MSP** (Orkney) expressed grave concern over a report on teacher numbers, which reveals that only 1 in 5 probationer teachers are in permanent, full-time jobs after qualifying in 2009-10. He said, "These figures lay bare the human cost to the SNP's mismanagement of Scottish education."

**Jim Hume MSP** (South Scotland) condemned the SNP for their hypocrisy over the Dunoon to Gourock ferry service. Jim said, "In opposition they promised a ferry service to suit the needs of the people of Argyll and Bute but they have totally failed to deliver."

**Tavish Scott MSP** (Shetland) has called for an urgent review of Government cuts to the Air Discount Scheme (ADS) which will increase costs of flights to and from the Northern and Western Isles. "Many people across Shetland have raised with me their concerns about this cut to the ADS which the SNP imposed without consultation," Tavish said.

#### Rennie supports minimum pricing on alcohol

Willie Rennie has indicated that the Lib Dems will back renewed SNP plans to impose a minimum price for alcohol. He said the proposal is necessary to fight Scotland's unhealthy relationship with drink.

#### Supreme Court tawdry language criticised

The First Minister and Justice Minister were criticised by Lib



Dem Leader Willie Rennie for using tawdry language in their attacks on senior judges which threatened the independence of the judicial system.

Alex Salmond was accused of seeking to surrender power and influence by calling for Scottish human rights appeals to be heard by the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg instead of the UK Supreme Court. Willie Rennie expressed grave concern that no matter how much power and influence Scotland would lose because of this move, Alex Salmond's mantra will still be 'anywhere but London'.

### Liberal Democrat manifesto pledges – now being delivered in Government

- We have increased the income tax threshold by £1000, lifting 880,000 low earners out of tax. The threshold will increase in each year of the coalition, eventually lifting 3 million people out of tax altogether.
- We have restored the earnings link with state pensions and guaranteed that pensions will rise by at least 2.5% every year.
